Section 3. Hazards identification

Physical state : Liquid. [Liquid.]
Emergency overview : DANGER!

Section 4. First aid measures

Eye contact : In case of contact, immediately flush eyes with cool running water. Remove contact lenses and continue flushing with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention immediately.
Skin contact : In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water. Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. Get medical attention. Wash clothing before reuse. Clean shoes thoroughly before reuse.
Inhalation : If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If exposed person is not breathing, give artificial respiration or oxygen applied by trained personnel. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
Ingestion : If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention immediately.

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Section 5. Fire fighting measures

Flash point : >93.3 °C (Closed cup)
Product does not support combustion.
Hazardous thermal decomposition products : Decomposition products may include the following materials:
phosphorus oxides
Fire-fighting media and instructions : Use an extinguishing agent suitable for the surrounding fire.
Dike area of fire to prevent runoff.
In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst.
Special protective equipment for fire-fighters : Fire-fighters should wear appropriate protective equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) with a full face-piece operated in positive pressure mode.

Section 6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions : Use suitable protective equipment (section 8). Do not allow to enter drains or watercourses.
Environmental precautions : Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers.
Methods for cleaning up : For small spills, add absorbent (soil may be used in the absence of other suitable materials), scoop up material and place in a sealable, liquid-proof container for disposal. For large spills, dike spilled material or otherwise contain it to ensure runoff does not reach a waterway. Place spilled material in an appropriate container for disposal.

Section 7. Handling and storage

Handling : Do not ingest. Do not get in eyes. Avoid contact with skin and clothing. Avoid breathing vapors, spray or mists. Keep container closed. Use only with adequate ventilation. Wash thoroughly after handling.
Storage : Keep out of reach of children. Keep container in a cool, well-ventilated area. Keep container tightly closed.
Store between the following temperatures: 0 and 50°C

Section 8. Exposure controls/personal protection

Engineering measures : Use only with adequate ventilation. If user operations generate dust, fumes, gas, vapor or mist, use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation or other engineering controls to keep worker exposure to airborne contaminants below any recommended or statutory limits. Provide suitable facilities for quick drenching or flushing of the eyes and body in case of contact or splash hazard.
